

## Remembering... ALWIN "AL" MULLER

This year, 2000, all of us who love letics, lost a comrade. Al Muller passed away.

Al was inducted into the Wrestling a half century of promoting and con-

tributing to the great sport of wrestling. Worth noting here is the fact that consistent with his lifelong dedication, Al worked on compiling the following profile of this years High School and College wrestling season up to a few days before he passed away.

A graduate of Springfield, he came to St. Paul's in 1950 where he coached football. basketball and baseball. In 1953, he started wrestling program and in his last four years won league championships. Championships and placed third twice in the championship every year they had a team. National Tournament.

He moved to Herricks in 1960 where wrestling and the core values of amateur ath- he coached the Junior Varsity under Paul Mott. He took over the Varsity in 1962 and coached at that level until 1976. From 1976 to Hall of Fame just a few years ago after almost 1992 he coached the Junior High and assisted Al Turkel in the Middle School.

> In the forty years of coaching wrestling, he won over 200 dual matches. His Herricks team finished second and third in the Section VIII tournaments and won seven Conference Championships. He had two State Championships and seven Section VII Championships. His last season at Herricks was 1967 when they went 16-0.

While at Herricks, he also served as backfield coach on the football team and assisted Alan Butler He had four Lehigh National Prep School in lacrosse. His archery teams won the section
